Archaeological Field School and Study Abroad

Join us for an exploration of the early Middle Ages at the royal Great Moravian center of Pohansko in the Czech Republic. On this five-week trip, students learn and practice modern archaeological techniques. Weekends are free for group travel or individual exploration. Students are housed near Břeclav's rail station, providing access to Vienna, Brno, Prague, Bratislava and Budapest, all within a few hours. Training includes the use of state-of-the-art total stations, laser levels and Geographic Information Systems.

THE COST OF \$3,233 (PLUS AIRFARE) INCLUDES:

- All transportation in the Czech Republic
- Housing for the entire stay
- Most meals
- Admissions to museums and field locations
- Three nights accommodations in Prague
- Use of all equipment and facilities
- Six semester credit hours at C.O.D.
- All applicable program and class fees

Students will be under the supervision of College of DuPage Professor John P. Staeck, Ph.D., and Jiří Macháček of Masaryk University-Brno. Student to staff ratios are kept at 5:1 or less, and all instruction is in English.
